

He speaks at schools to educate students on the importance of their language, their impact of bullying as well, as the importance of mental health. Having spoken to many corporations and companies, Brock sees the value in educating individuals in corporate settings. Not only does this help employees live authentically, it helps them engage with their children or in a coaching they do but it also can be of benefit to the corporation to help them create a more inclusive workforce.

Anti-Racism Charter: Highlights Since Launch

In October 2022, Recreation Nova Scotia launched their Anti-Racism Charter in Recreation, following extensive community and sector engagement. The Charter set out to determine a unified path forward to address issues of systemic racism in recreation. Learn more about the key principles of the Charter and how it is being used by over 30 organisations in Nova Scotia to inform action plans and new ways of working. Guarding our Guards

In December 2023, Jazmin Jefferson was a 21-year-old lifeguard in Washington, D.C. who experienced cardiac arrest while on stand; she collapsed into the basin she was guarding. Her backup lifeguards were completing admin duties in the pool office and maintenance in the pump room. Jazmin was submerged for at least 7 minutes and died from her injuries in hospital. This is one of several recent instances of injury/death of lifeguards in Canada and the USA. This session will take a case study approach to review multiple cases and key takeaways. Attendees will leave this session with strategies and resources to assess and implement improvements at their aquatic facilities.

Asset Managment for Recreation Facilities

AIM Network is a non-profit training and education organization with a mandate to assist Atlantic Canadian communities with long-term, sustainable infrastructure planning. This session will provide an overview of the basics of asset management with a focus on recreation facilities. Matt will highlight the benefits to the facility operators in saving time and money by identifying critical activities by risk and planning funding strategies for large expenses before they are required. He will also discuss the issue of operating services with limited time, resources, and financing that is facing infrastructure managers across Canada. Lastly, he will demonstrate free, excel-based tools to assist in tracking assets and forecasting expenses that have been developed through work with the Province of Newfoundland and Labrador, Nova Scotia and dozens of municipalities in Atlantic Canada.

This has caused a huge pause in delivering Reconciliation initiatives across the country. This workshop will provide an overview of how to better understand Indigenous perspectives from lived experiences and put "ACTION" into this important work. Through the process of unlearning, and by thinking and doing things "outside the box", true understanding & positive impacts can take place.

Unlocking Canada's Ice Potential

Access to ice time is a significant barrier to the growth of ice sports in Canada. Every day, thousands of Canadians flow in and out of the ~2,900 indoor rinks across the country. Canadians report problems such as lack of available ice times, unaffordable ice times, ice times that require extensive travel, inefficiencies with scheduling, bias or favouritism around the best ice times, and not enough rinks. Currently there is not a universal system in Canada to track ice-time usage.

The mission of the Open Ice project is to increase participation in ice sports by addressing the issue of access to ice time. The Open Ice project is led by the Future of Hockey Lab, a social innovation lab established in 2021 to solve complex problems in hockey.


